# Protect more dogs against Canine cough

With more social dogs comes more risk of canine cough. Most dogs are at risk, yet less than 20% are currently vaccinated<sup>1</sup>. This guide, based on input from Irish veterinary practices, provides advice on increasing uptake of canine cough vaccination. We consider Canine Cough to be part of our core vaccines. Thankfully we have not seen a case of distemper or hepatitis in a very long time, and we see relatively few cases of leptospirosis and parvovirus. We see a case of Canine Cough per branch per week. Canine Cough is the most infectious canine disease we see and therefore it is vitally important that we protect our patients.
